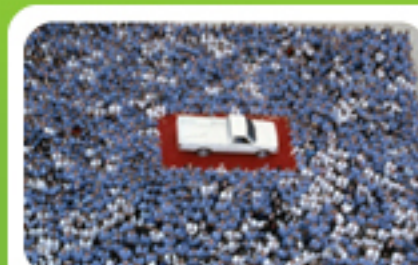

*Xterra is no longer assembled in the U.S.

Nissan Pathfinder Job One
First time the SUV is assembled outside of Japan

Nissan Maxima Job One
First time Nissan's flagship sedan is assembled outside of Japan



2012
INFINITI JX35 Job One
First INFINITI vehicle assembled in Tennessee
*INFINITI JX35 has been rebadged to INFINITI QX60



2012
Nissan LEAF Job One
Domestic assembly of the world's first mass-market electric vehicle



2013
Nissan Rogue Job One
First time the SUV is assembled outside of Japan

2013
Assembly milestone:
10 MILLION vehicles



2014
Annual production capacity increases to 640,000+, making Nissan Smyrna the highest-volume vehicle assembly plant in North America



September 2020
Assembly of All-new 2021 Nissan Rogue begins



October 2020
Assembly of the Nissan Murano begins

December 2020
14 MILLION vehicles assembled
